


Workers' Compensation Losses 2022-2023 Year in Review


Beyond COVID-19

Beyond COVID-related claims, Members experienced an increase in claims and associated losses across various departments in 2022-2023. Here's a breakdown of claims reported by department and an overview of the past five years.



Fatal Injuries

The ultimate sacrifice of any Member's employee is the loss of life associated with an on-the-job event. While workers' compensation loss experience returned to more historical norms in 2022-2023, the frequency of non-COVID fatal incidents increased sharply. A five-year comparison of non-COVID fatal injuries is shown below along with some detail of each of the tragic events in 2022-2023. This information is provided as a means of educating employees as to the random nature of these occurrences and the impacts on employees, the workplace, and families.



Fatal Injuries in 2022/2023

City of Dalhart - Two members of the volunteer fire department were involved in a head-on collision while returning from a call.

City of Levelland - Two animal control officers were struck by a pickup truck while clearing an animal carcass from the roadway.

City of Carrollton - A police officer was struck by a passing motorist during an investigation.

City of Grand Prairie - A police officer was involved in a vehicle crash during a pursuit.

Eagle Pass Waterworks - An employee drowned after falling into a water reservoir.

City of Laredo - An employee fell from a ladder into an empty clarifier.

City of West - A volunteer firefighter was struck while working an accident scene.

City of Cameron - A police officer was shot while serving a warrant for domestic violence.

Hidalgo Drainage District #1 - An employee was struck by a backhoe.
